PROFESSIONAL COMMENTS

TP04 (Conservation Areas)

The applicant's attention is drawn to Section 206 (1) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, in accordance with which (a) replacement tree(s) shall be planted to the satisfaction of the Local Planning Authority.

Under section 213 of the Act the same duty is imposed on the landowner following the removal of trees in a conservation area:

"If a tree in a conservation area is removed, uprooted or destroyed in contravention of section 211 the landowner is placed under a duty to plant another tree of an appropriate size and species at the same place as soon as he or she reasonably can. The same duty applies if a tree is removed because it is dead, dying or dangerous or because it is causing a nuisance. The duty attaches to subsequent owners of the land, although the LPA have powers to dispense with the duty. The LPA may enforce the duty by serving a tree replacement notice under section 207 of the Act" Tree Preservation Orders A Guide to the Law and Good Practice.
