

## Photos of the proposed site in Warren Gardens, East Twickenham for a memorial to First World War Belgian Refugees



A side view of the central paved oval space proposed as a site for the Belgian memorial. Richmond Bridge Estate is just beyond the shrubbery to the right, with garden space immediately beside the proposed memorial site and a block of residential flats at a greater distance, touching the park boundary.

The central oval paved space – the site of the proposed memorial – looking inward to Richmond Bridge Estate as seen from the Warren Footpath. The space immediately beyond the paved area and shrubbery is the Richmond Bridge Estate garden. The proposed memorial would stand at the centre of this paved space. The heavy plant growth which can be seen between the paving stones would need attention.



The central oval paved area seen from the inner shrubbery, looking outward across the river. This shows how the memorial would always be seen from the river and opposite bank, as plant growth on the river bank is always kept low here because of the river steps. This photo shows the remaining stump of the large Willow which fell at this spot recently. This would need to be removed.
