U14493 Tree works standards

All tree works should be undertaken by a specialist contractor in accordance with British Standard: BS 3998: 2010 'Recommendations for tree work' and the current AFAG group best practice.

U14494 Wildlife and Countryside Act

A tree may provide a habitat for plants and wildlife protected under the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 and other legislation. Trees with hollow crevices, for example, provide important natural roost sites for many bat species covered by the 1981 Act. Anyone proposing to carry out work on a tree which may be used as a roost site for bats or by other protected species should first consult Natural England Berkshire, Office Block A, Government Buildings, Coley Avenue, Coley Park, Reading, Berkshire, RG1 6DT.
