







**EXISTING SOUTH ELEVATION** 


**EXISTING EAST ELEVATION** 














**EXISTING GROUND FLOOR PLAN** 


**EXISTING FIRST FLOOR PLAN**









**EXISTING SOUTH ELEVATION** 


**EXISTING EAST ELEVATION** 














**EXISTING GROUND FLOOR PLAN** 


**EXISTING FIRST FLOOR PLAN**


