1883 Servant's Bedrooms

Built as the 'new garret' in 1771-72, the smaller of two rooms formed in the space above the Great North Bedchamber. Unusually, it was finished without a fireplace and its C18 use is unknown But it could have functioned either as a lumber room or servants' dormitory. During the late C19, when the linking corridor was formed through the second floor, this and the three rooms to the east were used as servants' bedrooms.

The present south and east walls (lath and plaster) represent a post-1924 alteration. Prior to that date, this room was divided from the passageway and the adjacent room by a light-weight joinery partition, the ghosts of which can still be seen on the walls. Despite the repeated renewal of the north elevation to combat dry rot, much of the early lath and plaster survives, and the door joinery (though in a C20 position) all remain from the first period of construction. The winding garret stairs, the irregular plan of the passageway as indicated on the reconstruction drawings and the leaded lights to the casement windows (now lost) formed a romantic, neomedleval interior.

## S/1/12 LANDING AND STAIRCASE TO ROUND LIBRARY and flight down

Part of the 1761 construction phase the top landing of the back stairs in its first form was a winding passageway, leading to a remote bed chamber in the tower. The present stair from the first floor rose to the landing and a further short flight with winders was positioned to the south (site of S/1/13) leading to a door positioned on the west wall (removed 1861).

When the new garret was inserted above the Great North Bedchamber in 1771, the additional straight run of balustrade was inserted with the new landing extending to the north leading onto the garret stairs (\$/1/9.2). To accommodate the additional length of landing the walls at the north end of the room were raised slightly. The shadow of this extension can still be read on the west wall. On the east wall at the south end a blind door was inserted to balance the new door to the north garret, where the partition of \$/1/13 meets the wall. The ghost of the lancet-arch shaped opening can be read as a crack in the lining paper. This arrangement of the stair remained until 1861 when the tower was extended and the overall plan of the stair simplified. Lady Waldegrave's alteration of the stair (1861) removed the short flight leading to the Print Room (\$/1/15) at the south end of the landing and blocked the door to the print room. A new short flight was inserted at the north end with a new door inserted into the upper closet.

During the C20, a new bathroom was formed at the south end and during the 1980 ARUP roofing campaign the roof and ceiling were renewed and the roof light inserted.

## S/1/13 Top-lit Bathroom

<1790 Top landing of stairs to Round Bedchamber and Upper Closet

During the C18 this space was part of the top landing of the Back Stairs only partitioned during the Pugin and Pugin works. During the C18 and until 1861 a short flight of stairs was positioned where the partition now sits. The stairs linked the top landing with the Print Room. During the 1771-72 works, with the addition of the garrets and passageway to the east, the landing and this area were altered. The east wall of this room and \$/1/12 were fitted with a pair of doors. The southern, was blind and the ghost of the door straddles the line of the partition, whilst the northern one led to the new garret above the Great North Bedchamber.

The present room was last redecorated  $\sim$ 1972. When the roof of the gallery was renewed by ARUP (1980) the ceiling was renewed and the roof light inserted.
