Comment: Marble Hill is the only surviving Thames side villa (as opposed to palace/mansion) which has substantially retained its context. As such it is key to the understanding of the ideas of Pope's generation that profoundly altered the notion of landscape and created the idea of an Arcadian Thames which had enormous influence on future landscape design. The house itself is an early and very pure example of neo-Palladianism.

It has become sadly decayed and the landscape degraded and has lost much of the original form as represented by the drawings used as the basis for the English Heritage application.

The application has clearly been very thoroughly researched and appears at least to address some of the problems of viability. English Heritage must be give a chance to make the site financially viable.
