#### Parking and Driving Safely/Dangerous Parking

**Description**

This is an ongoing issue but we included the following in our newsletters dated 11th and 18th January: PARKING AND DRIVING SAFELY - 11th January 2019 Disappointingly, we have already been notified this term about some very dangerous activity involving drivers parking on zigzag lines and in other inappropriate places. We frequently make appeals to you all not to park on zigzag lines; this causes very dangerous situations and we must remember that many children are walking to school on their own each day. If we present them with hazards there could be an accident. PLEASE put children first and park sensibly. As you are no doubt aware, the police are notified when registration numbers can be obtained. Most parents and carers do take great care to park in the correct places, even at a little distance from school; we are really appealing to the few who are causing the problem and

## Illegal/inappropriate Parking

**Description**

This is an ongoing issue but in this instance a car was seen mounting the pavement to park, illegally, narrowly missing a child.

## Illegal footway parking

**Description**

Collis parents are parking illegally in the pavement in a narrow street near the school. Neighbours have raised concerns about this, particularly around children's safety, in relation to (1) having to use the road as pedestrians rather than the blocked pavement and (2) potential injuries from cars when they drive on to the pavement.

**Actions**

1 Regular reminders to be sent to parents re not parking illegally on pavements, via school newsletter. 2 Support for the neighbour's request for double yellow lines, signposts and pavement obstructions. 3 Illegal parking to be raised by the Headteacher at Nursery and Reception new parent evenings.
