am writing to you to express my concerns about the above mentioned planning proposals in the hope that you can do something to bring about a change.

Whilst acknowledging the need to provide more housing within urban areas this proposal as a whole shows wanton disregard for the consequences to those people already living in the vicinity, and to reserving the feel of the area.

The decimation of the existing green space is unacceptable. The designers should be forced to stay within the bounds of the brown site (existing brewery etc) for all the new building works including bouses, flats, school and additional facilities, even - or especially - if this means downscaling the whole thing in terms of numbers of units.
