Comment: Dear Richmond Council,

I would like to object to the proposed Barnes Hospital planning application on the following grounds:

Adequacy of parking/loading/turning Highway safety Traffic generation Noise and disturbance resulting from use

As a resident of South Worple Way, it appears that the concerns raised over highway safety have not been fully understood or taken into account with this planning application.

South Worple Way is a SINGLE TRACK road with two way access; the pavement is narrow along the whole length of the road (a child's buggie and a single person cannot pass) and there is a tricky level crossing at the junction with White Hart Lane that causes congestion for about 50% of every hour that passes.

Motorists not only use South Worple Way as a rat run to avoid the Upper Richmond Road at peak times but frequently aim directly at any traffic coming towards them. Inevitably, the only option is to scrape past the oncoming vehicles using all of the narrow pavement with pedestrians sent flying. The outside wall of my house has been damaged owing to this practice. As a cyclist, there is hardly room to pass a single car and I have been almost knocked off several times. After the frustration of the level crossing waiting time and finally reaching South Worple Way, motorists tend to accelerate madly (way over the 20/30 mph limit) and it is only a matter of time before a child/pet/person is hit coming out of The Retreat or the alleyway by 6 South Worple Way. Please note that many children use this route to/from Barnes or East Sheen primary schools. My comments above do not even include the well known concerns over the White Hart Lane/South Worple Way railway junction which is both problematic and dangerous at busy times of the day. Needless to say, the traffic generation from this planning application would certainly exacerbate these problems and cause even further mayhem. I have pictures taken of the above situations if it is helpful.

Although the residents of South Worple Way are used to noise from the railway, any additional disturbance which may well breach acceptable noise levels and we seek to your assurance on this matter.
