I object very strongly to the proposals on the grounds that the road infrastructure surrounding the area cannot support the numbers of vehicles the site will generate, not only with the huge lorries using the small surrounding roads to get to the site during the building works, but also the extra numbers of commercial delivery vehicles servicing the new houses and flats after they have been built; ie rubbish collection, food and other delivery vehicles, removals etc. How will they reach the site?
