Opposition to Mortlake Brewery development

To whom it may concern,

I am writing to object in the strongest possible terms to the development plans for Mortlake Brewery.

Firstly the surrounding infrastructure such as roads and the railway crossing at Mortlake and junction at Chalker's Corner cannot cope with the existing levels of traffic and everything will grind to a complete halt if the proposed plans are passed which will see the local area overwhelmed by such a massive influx of people and vehicles. This will have a hugely detrimental effect on local businesses in Mortlake, Richmond, Barnes, Twickenham and Chiswick as people simply won't bother to go there.
