The applicant, Dukes Education, propose to establish a new senior school within the listed Kneller Hall and its environs in Whitton.

The landscape design seeks to address the site constraints, particularly the protection of the Metropolitan Open Land, the heritage assets of the site, the existing protected tree stock and the green corridor to the north of the site. We have been advising on the sports pitch provision in consultation with Sport England and working with the transport consultant to minimise the impact of the student drop off.

Site Context and Location

Kneller Hall and it's surroundings are located in Whitton within the London borough of Richmond. The site is within 10 minutes walking distance from Whitton town centre and train station.

The site is located in a predominantly residential area of 2 storey detached and semi detached homes.

Site Context and Location - Public Open Spaces within Local Area

1. Whitton Park Sports Association

- grass pitches, outdoor tennis courts, sports club, disability access, car parking.

The Kneller Hall site was not publicly accessible when it was occupied by the Royal Military School of Music. The site was owned and managed by the MOD, with the sports pitches on the site used by the members of the Royal Military School, when they were based at the site. The existing local population has access to a number of publicly accessible green spaces, within a 5 and 10 minute walk of the site.

The proposal site is located off Kneller Road and Whitton Dene, it is a stunning site with large area of landscape a part of which is designated as Metropolitan Open Land.

The sites previously housed the Royal Military School of Music and as such has a campus layout with a number of 20th century buildings scattered across the western half of the site. Pre-dating the RMSM are three listed buildings the main building; Kneller hall which is grade II listed as well as the curtilage listed Gaurdshouse and band practice hall.

The eastern half of the site is Metropolitan Open Land containing sports pitches.
