Comments

Comment: My address is 23 Myrtle Road, TW12 1QE so very near to the proposed development. I continue to object to the proposed development regardless of the adjustments made in this latest application and my reasons remain the same.

SCALE: The development is too big for, and totally out of scale with, the area and, if allowed will set a precedent for more high rises which scar the landscape.

CONGESTION: Traffic congestion in the area is already problematic and the quantity of vehicles generated by the development will exacerbate problems. Myrtle Road is next to Holly Road (which would likely be an access road nor used for overspill parking) both of which are narrow. I can remember when Job's dairy was there and the grief that caused with too many vehicles jostling for space. Parking is already an issue so would be made worse by an increase in both residential and business vehicles.

POLLUTION: The pollution generated will be unacceptable (even if electric cars are involved, it's not just engines which cause pollution). I would have thought that reducing pollution is one of the Council's policies.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING: We certainly need more residential properties but they should be affordable, which I doubt the proposed ones will be, and should be built in sympathy with the area. Hampton Hill is now identified by the Council as a 'village' so buildings should reflect that village environment.
