

Fire Safety Strategy

SITE: 21 Holmesdale Road Teddington TW11 9LJ

PROPOSAL: Construction of garden room

- London Plan Policy D12 requires development proposals to achieve the highest standards of fire safety, embedding these at the earliest possible stage: "In the interests of fire safety and to ensure the safety of all building users, all development proposals must achieve the highest standards of fire safety...."
- London Plan Policy D12(B) states: "all major development proposals should be submitted with a Fire Statement..." Major development proposals should demonstrate within the Fire Statement how the proposals respond to and contain information on the requirements of both parts A and B of London Plan Policy.
- 3. The garden room however is not a major development. No one will live in the building and as it is only a few meters wide, the means of escape in the event of a fire is not an issue.
- 4. The Richmond Council Local Validation Checklist (Appendix) explains what is required for a householder application.



- 5. Criteria 1- Information on space provision and assembly points is not relevant to a small garden room.
- 6. Criteria 2- Information on passive and active safety measures is not relevant to a small garden room.
- 7. Criteria 3- The building will be constructed with the appropriate fire resistance.
- 8. Criteria 4- Information on the means of escape and evacuation strategy is not relevant to a small garden room.
- 9. Criteria 6- Information for access and equipment for firefighting is not relevant to a small garden room.
