Comment: Without impractical changes to road and train frequency, this proposal is crass.

It should be assessed in the context of the traffic, parking and pollution issues that will already result from the more major plans for the Stag brewery site and also - temporarily? - from the current heavy traffic, parking and pollution resulting from the unresolved closure of Hammersmith Bridge.

Even without the brewery development, the Barnes Hospital redevelopment would generate extra traffic to exacerbate the existing congestion in South Worple Way - a two-way road where, as cars have got wider, opposing traffic can no longer safely pass.

Even without the brewery development, this Barnes Hospital redevelopment would generate extra traffic at the junction of South Worple Way with White Hart Lane. The junction is situated at one of the most dangerous and busiest combined traffic/pedestrian crossings on the London rail network.

Vehicle access to South Worple Way from White Hart Lane is restricted and already results in selfish and dangerous driving.

The additional pedestrian and vehicular traffic resulting from the proposed hospital development means it cannot reasonably be allowed to succeed.
