DETAILED REASONS

U0188266 Reason for Refusal - Design

The proposed dormer roof extension, by reason of its siting, design, inappropriate material and scale, would result in an unsympathetic and incongruous form of development that would adversely impact on the character of the host building and cause less than substantial harm to the character and appearance of the CA2 Kew Green Conservation Area. There are no public benefits to outweigh this harm. The proposal is therefore in conflict with the NPPF (2023) and Richmond Local Plan (2018), in particular policies LP1 and LP3, Publication Local Plan policies 28 and 29, the SPD on House Extensions and External Alterations (2015) and the CA2 Kew Green Conservation Area Statement and CA2 Kew Green Conservation Area Study.

HOT Applications Making an Appeal – Summary Guidance

Whether to appeal

If the Local Planning Authority (LPA) turn down your application, you should look carefully at the reasons why they turned it down before you make an appeal. You should speak to the LPA to see if you can sort out the problem - perhaps by changing your proposal. An appeal should only ever be a last resort.

Type of appeal

Refusal of permission for HOT applications – this type of appeal is appropriate for domestic alterations and extensions and any ancillary development in the garden. It is not appropriate for alterations to flats.

Appeal time

Within 12 weeks of the date of this notice.

Who can appeal

The applicant or their agent may lodge an appeal

The appeals process

Appeals must be made

- Online at www.planninginspectorate.gov.uk, or
- Using a form which you can get from Initial Appeals, The Planning Inspectorate, Temple Quay House, 2 The Square, Temple Quay, Bristol BS1 6PN.

It will be expected that all appeal documentation will be submitted electronically.

The Planning Inspectorate (on behalf of the Secretary of State) will determine the appeal procedure to be followed. Normally this will proceed by way of the Householder Appeal Service which will rely solely on information submitted at application stage. The Council will send copies of any letters of objection or support they received when considering your application. Further submissions or statements will not be accepted by the Planning Inspectorate.

Your householder appeal will be decided by a Planning Inspector. He/she will consider all the application documents and grounds of appeal and also make an unaccompanied visit to the appeal site. You may be required to provide access to the site for the Inspector.

Appeal decision

80% of householder appeal decisions will be issued within 8 weeks from the start date of the appeal.
