Demolition of existing structures and redevelopment of site including construction of three new buildings comprising 106 residential units of mixed tenure (Use Class C3), alterations and conversion of two existing buildings for 3 residential use (Use Class C3), car and cycle parking, landscaping and associated works.

Comment: I should like to object to the proposal for a number of reasons. One of my main concerns is the increased volume of traffic. The area is already sometimes in gridlock. This has been made worse for some time by the closure of Hammersmith Bridge. South Worple way has become increasingly dangerous, with narrow pavements in parts and cars using it as a rat run to avoid the Upper Richmond Road which is sometimes jammed with traffic. There is often congestion at the junction with White Hart Lane, particularly as the level crossing gates are closed for a considerable time every hour. The traffic adds danger to pedestrians and also fumes to the polluted air which we are breathing anyway. In addition to the homes which will have their own cars, there will be increased deliveries and service vehicles and visitors to the residents. The housing density has become too great in the area and there are other developments already being proposed. These will add to the population and to the traffic of course. East Sheen is a very popular area and has quite a dense population as it is.

I also have concerns about any proposals for heating the residences. We are trying to move away from the use of gas but it is unlikely that more planet friendly alternatives are being planned and this will add to global warming and the climate crisis.

Homes in Grosvenor Gardens are likely to be overlooked by the new properties which are planned.

overall, this proposal is totally unsuitable for the site under consideration and I urge the council to reject it.
