Type of comment: Object to the proposal

Comment: I object on the basis of highway safety, increased traffic which the single track road (South Worple Way) cannot handle and buildings density.

This application must be considered in real physical terms.

South Worple Way is a single track road for 50/100 meters before it joins White Hart Lane. It is not possible for cars to pass.

Care already cut up WHL on the wrong side of the road when the railway crossing is closed and turn into South Worple Way. With inevitable increased traffic this will become more dangerous. It's an accident that is waiting to happen and increased traffic will promote this. It's endearing local residents.

The residents of the new units will only access South Worple Way. It's narrow at various places. It's a walk way to St Mary Magdalen primary school with prams etc.

It is not right as a matter of fact to describe this as a two way road as cars, let alone vans, cannot pass.

The developers only interest is profit. Packing the site and over developing it.

The council should support local residents who already have to put up with massive increased traffic due to Hammersmith Bridge being shut.

The railway crossing is down more than almost any other in the UK and it cannot handle this increased traffic.

Please deal with the reality of the application as it will effect residents.
